

Example 2: Search for published sources & respective scholarly publications

Task: to find basic literature on Magdeburg law in Poland.

Solutions:

1. Simple query through a popular, AI-aided web browser: it gave us at least one valuable reference to a book in English and a link to one of the academic gateways (see [here](#)).
2. Query of a logged-in user in an academic library catalogue (in this case, Jagiellonian Library): the search has been limited to more recent publications only, it gave us relevant results concerning both printed and online books, including important new monographs & source editions, among which there is the book by the Leipzig-based team in the series IVS SAXONICO-MAIDEBVRGENSE IN ORIENTE, containing an extensive bibliography of the topic (see [here](#)).
3. Query of a registered user in the academic services provided by the same library: through [EBSCO DS](#) and [BREPOLiS](#): it provided lists of publications that were not less useful than the ones obtained through the library catalogue and sometimes also full texts.

Nota bene: The lists obtained through various services vary, and it is a hint to use several services at a time in order to quickly get a useful bibliography for a study of a given topic.
